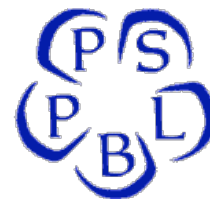

Leadership 21 is a five-day seminar that focuses on building transformational skills through a form of emotional intelligence called Primal Leadership. The goal is to help police leaders cope with personal motivation in a rules-based culture and learn how to more flexibly lead during a time of turbulent change.

Emotional Intelligence

Emotional Intelligence (EI) is the capacity to recognize, interpret and manage one's own emotions and those of others. EI has major impact over our ability to influence others, resolve conflict, and see our own actions more clearly in times of stress. It also influences our personal, and professional, happiness and satisfaction.

Primal Leadership

You will learn what it takes to master Primal Leadership. Primal Leadership is the ability to harness EI competencies in order to help your colleagues and employees become flexible innovators, creative followers, and the kind of people who can help you transform law enforcement for the better.

- Innovating the mousetraps, dealing with elephants.
